# Defences

Reasonable belief the complainant did not have impairment

Not sexual exploitation







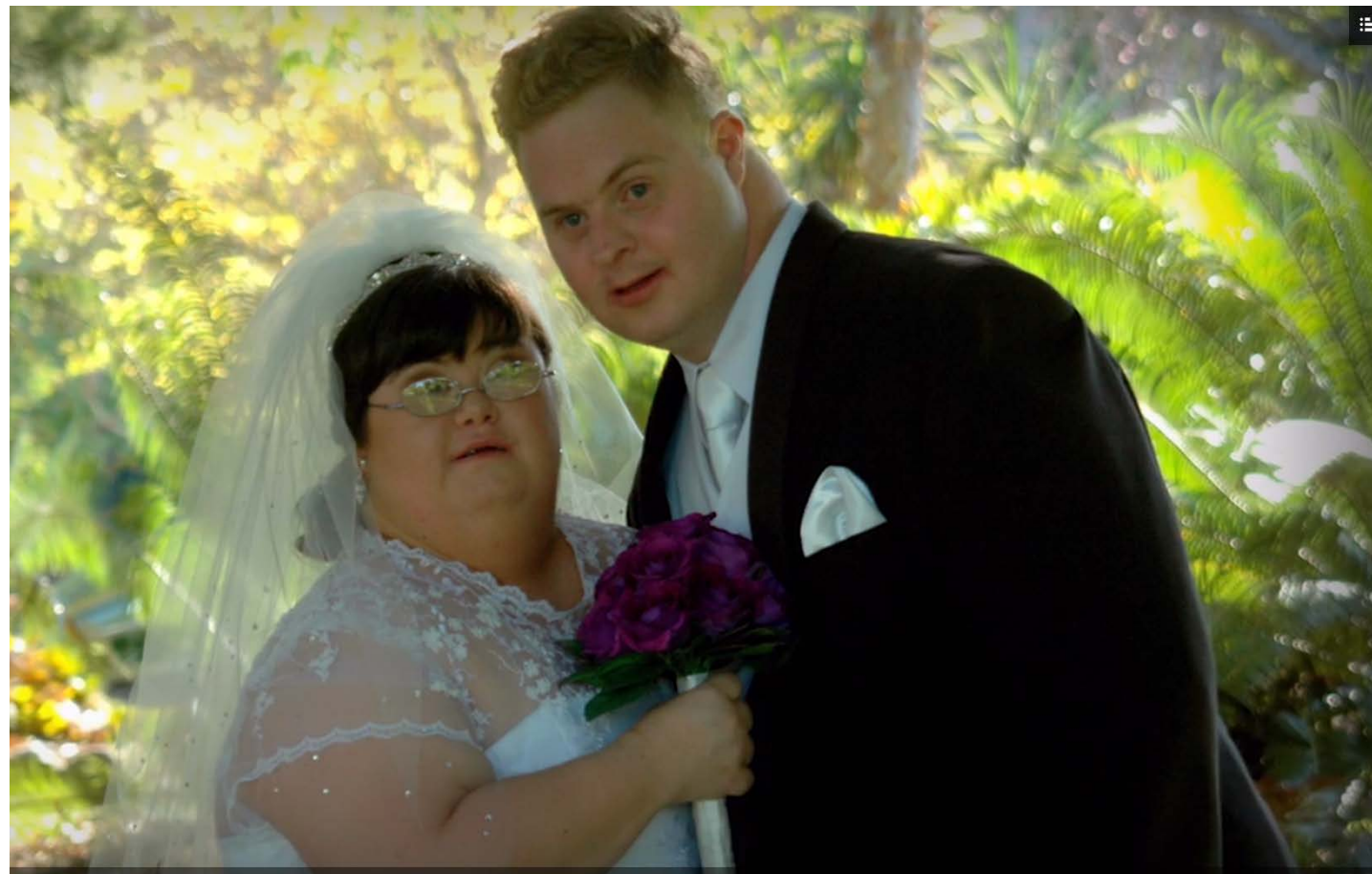
**person with an impairment of the mind** means  
a person with a disability that—

(a) is attributable to an intellectual, psychiatric,  
cognitive or neurological impairment or a  
combination of these; and (b) results in—

(i) a substantial reduction of the person's  
capacity for communication, social interaction  
or learning; and

(ii) the person needing support
